Essential Duties

Coordinate with project management team for assignment of all team members.

Assign and coordinate all trade field assignments with the needs of various projects.

Perform supervisory responsibilities without daily input from project manager.

Ability to operate independently with issues of change orders, documentation, permitting, inspections, project closeout, and quality assurance.

Constantly review project schedules with team. Ensure that critical activities and decisions remain on task and that required-on-job (ROJ) dates are provided to the project management team.

Document project field issues that impact budget, quality or schedule, and provide to the project management team.

Respond to subcontractor requests for field issues that impact budget, quality or schedule.

Provide team oversight for development and maintenance of a resource allocation control system (RACS).

Provide guidance in implementation of the project's quality assurance/quality control (QA/QC) program.

Identify projects with self-perform opportunities and assist in the development of the self-perform options.

Implement all Seawood Builders' safety standards.

Maintain a well-organized, expedient, and well-document project.

Accept full-responsibility for the project and in-effect the bottom line for all work performed. Project ability range includes technically-complex shell construction through high-quality interior finishes.
